The Pioneers Luncheons were introduced by former President of the then Shire of Cockburn, Councillor Alan Thomas in 1971.

Since then the descendants of pioneering families of the district have come together on this very special day to reflect on days gone by, to share a story or two, to foster lifelong friendships and to remember our 'absent' friends since we last met.

The values of hard work, honesty, mateship and commitment are those that have made Cockburn such a great places to live, to raise a family, to work, to operate a small business and to those seeking to invest in our community.

These values are considered when the announcement of the Cockburn Citizen of the Year Award is made each year.

Last year, we announced Mrs Nola Waters as the recipient of this award.

The announcement of the 2016 recipient will be made later this afternoon.

At last year's luncheon many of you would remember that I thanked our community for the enormous effort to stop the 'carve up' of Cockburn.

Challenged with the prospect of division, we united.

Our community sent a shock wave through the State Government's plan to divide our great City.

Our efforts, together with several other local governments are credited with stopping the State-wide reform.

Not only did we prevent the 'carve up' of Cockburn, it strengthened our position for all time by starting a conversation with our residents and business communities about the foundation blocks that built this City, the contributions from people like yourself in this room and those that have followed in your footsteps and the dreams and aspirations that we all have for the future.

We stood together because it made sense for us to be together. The City of Cockburn remains one of the fastest growing local governments in the State.

We have a population of approximately 110,000 and over 7,000 local businesses in Cockburn. Collectively we have around 50,000 local jobs.

We want people who live in Cockburn to work in Cockburn wherever possible.

In last year's independent community satisfaction survey, our residents told us that their overall satisfaction with the City of Cockburn as a place to live was a record 93%.

Our community loves Cockburn and with your assistance we will continue to grow all aspects of Cockburn ensuring an increasing number of people moving to make Cockburn their home or place of work.

In light of our community's satisfaction, let me now address, again – yet another proposal has been made to the WA Local Advisory Board to have the suburbs of Hamilton Hill and North Coogee to come under the control of the City of Fremantle.

There are many lessons to learn about previous failed attempts to divide communities.

The process of dividing unwilling communities is costly.

It is disruptive.

We all remember the tremendous effort put forth by our community to stop the 'carving up' of Cockburn

I assure the community of Cockburn that your previous efforts to retain the City of Cockburn as we see it today, were not in vain.

I remain committed now, as I was then, to the continued unity and strength of our great City.

In closing, I thank each and every one of you for being here today and wish you good health and happiness for the future.
