Earlier this year the City of Cockburn launched the Nyungar Tourist Trail here at Port Coogee. Port Coogee is in important place of gathering for the Nyungar people. The new Trail showcases Ngarkal Beach, The Lookout and Aboriginal artworks which tell the important Aboriginal stories of this community.
