Wow - here we go again - the opening of another bicycle pump track in the City of Cockburn.

It was only on Friday 15 June, 2018 that the Yangebup Bicycle Pump Track was officially opened and we are only a few weeks away from the opening of the new Bibra Lake Skate Park. Things are really humming in Cockburn as the number of community projects unfold in line with the City's Strategic Community Plan, its long term Financial Plan and the large number of strategies, plans, policies, and position statements that underpin them.

This track has been funded by an Election Commitment from the Honourable Peter Tinley.

The Ottey Centre received \$110,000 in grant funding that was provided through the Local Projects/ Local Jobs grant which is administered by the Department of Local Government & Communities.

This funding helped upgrade the outside surrounds of the Ottey Centre and build the pump track and basketball court.

The pump track and basketball court funds were managed by the city with \$45,000 going towards the pump track and \$15,000 for the basketball court.

It is the Centres hope that the new track and street ball court will be more inviting for young people to use the centre and area.

The work has been completed in conjunction with two companies:

- Common Ground trails creating the design; and
- Three Chillis trails completing the build on the track.

A bit later on we are going to see demonstrations by local BMX pro riders on the pump track and Basketball WA representatives will be holding a skills and drills workshop on the new basketball area.

In closing, I take this opportunity to thank the State Government for their funding contribution and Mr Yaz Mubarkai MLA Member for Jandakot for his presence here today.

I know that those who have come along here today are eager to get out on the track - I'll ask a few of them to join Mr Yaz Mubarakia, Mr John Rich and myself in cutting the ribbon to officially open the South Lake Bicycle Pump Track.
