City Growth

Road Upgrades in 2024-25

Rockingham/Phoenix Road (Spearwood) intersection improvements – \$2.5m

The City is upgrading the Rockingham Road/Phoenix Road intersection by replacing the traffic signals with a new roundabout. This change aims to enhance traffic flow and safety while also addressing safety concerns at the Phoenix Road and Grandpre Crescent access.

Key features of the new roundabout and upgrades include:

- Reduced speeds: The curved approach, splitter islands that narrow the roadway, and a raised intersection design will naturally slow down traffic
- Fewer conflict points: The roundabout layout minimises and separates areas where traffic paths cross, significantly improving safety
- Cyclist-friendly design: Exit and entry ramps are provided within the roundabout for cyclists who prefer not to ride through it
- Upgraded street lighting: Enhanced lighting will improve visibility for both drivers and pedestrians.

The project is funded by the Australian Government's Black Spot Program and the City of Cockburn.



Beeliar Drive/Dunraven Drive intersection improvements – \$2.93m

The City is enhancing safety at this intersection with the installation of new traffic signals that will:

- Allow for protected turns and minimise the need for drivers to enter Beeliar Drive
- Provide safer crossings for pedestrians
- Increase visibility and predictability for cyclists.

Project stages:

Stage 1: (FY2024-25) Developing the detailed design

Stage 2: (FY2025-26) Installing the new signals.

This project is funded by the Australian Government's Black Spot Program and the City of Cockburn.





This project aims to enhance safety and accessibility for all road users and includes:

- Installing right turn arrow signals to replace the unprotected right turns from Rockingham Road onto Spearwood Avenue
- Realigning pathways and pedestrian crossings for increased safety.

This project is funded by the Australian Government's Black Spot Program.



Carrington Street/Forrest Road (Hamilton Hill) intersection improvements – \$1.3m

Improvements to the intersection of Carrington Street and Forrest Road in Hamilton Hill will enhance safety and usability for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists.

Key features include:

- Right turn arrows for the southern and eastern intersection approaches, to improve flow and reduce congestion
- Pedestrian signals and upgraded street lighting for increased safety
- Improved pedestrian and cyclist crossing facilities for easier and safer crossing
- A raised platform at the intersection to encourage lower speeds and create a calmer traffic environment.

Teaching kids how to be safe around dogs

Keeping our kids safe includes teaching them how to interact with dogs. Understanding dogs' likes, dislikes and signs of discomfort ensures safer, happier interactions. Every dog has its own distinct personality, much like humans. It's important for kids to understand the need to respect dogs and their boundaries and personal space.

Tips for kids

- Always get the owner's consent before approaching a dog
- Always pat softly
- Avoid pulling tails and fur
- No teasing or rough play
- Give dogs space
- Avoid hugging or restraining
- Let dogs eat and sleep in peace
- Use slow movements when around dogs
- Avoid loud noises.

Recognising signs of discomfort, such as growling, backing away, tucked tails or lowered ears will ensure a safer environment for both children and dogs, preventing potential incidents and fostering positive relationships.

There are many resources online to help teach your kids more about dogs. When we all understand dogs, we can all live happily together.

It is best to leave turtles alone as much as possible. If they need help, you can be a turtle bodyguard by assisting them in the direction they were heading and protecting them from predators. If it is heading towards land, it may be searching for a suitable nesting site. If it is heading towards a lake, it may be trying to migrate to water. If you see a hatchling turtle, you can take it straight to the nearest wetland.

By law, all dogs over three-months-old and cats over six-months-old must be registered with the City and microchipped. Cats must also be sterilised.

It's easier and cheaper to register your dog and cat once with our lifetime registration.

Keep batteries and aerosols out of any bin!

Over the last six months our drivers have responded to multiple fires in our waste collection trucks and facilities. These dangerous fires are caused by batteries or aerosols disposed of in red, yellow or green-topped bins. These items are classified as hazardous waste and cannot be placed in any bin.

To support the safe recovery and recycling of valuable materials our residents can drop off small amounts of hazardous waste, like batteries and aerosols, at our network of community recycling hubs.

Dry-cell batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, button cell, lithium and 9-volt batteries), light globes, mobile phones, and printer



toner cartridges can be dropped off at Cockburn ARC, Cockburn Youth Centre, The Wetlands Centre at Bibra Lake and Cockburn Libraries in Spearwood, Coolbellup and Success.

Aerosol cans, such as fly spray, oven cleaner, deodorant and hairspray, can be dropped at the Administration Building, the City's Operations Centre and Seniors Centre, Coolbellup Hub, Aubin Grove Community Centre, the Wetlands Centre and Cockburn ARC.

Help our wildlife over summer

Summer can be especially challenging for our local wildlife due to longer, hotter days and extreme weather. We can all take simple steps to provide water, create shade and offer safe environments, to help reduce these impacts and support our birds, small mammals and reptiles.

1. Place shallow dishes of water or a birdbath in shady areas of your garden and clean and top them up regularly, especially on very hot days. Use rocks and pebbles or large twigs to create safe access for

small animals

- 2. Create shaded areas and shelter around your garden with logs, leaves and brush piles
- 3. Planting native trees, flowers and shrubs provides food and habitat for native animals. ReWild Perth offers great tips for supporting wildlife in your garden
- 4. Be mindful of your pets at home and in our local parks. Wildlife may enter your garden seeking refuge from the heat. Keep dogs on a lead when out walking
- 5. Have a plan ready in the event you find an injured or heat stressed animal. Contact WA Wildlife for guidance and care.

Additionally, once a month on Sundays, I volunteer at the Cockburn Repair Cafe, where I repair furniture, sharpen garden equipment and work with glass and china. This wonderful group of volunteers has been going strong for the past five years, and I'm pleased to say that I was there when it opened.

On top of that, my work as a Justice of the Peace and my Council commitments on weekends certainly keep me busy. I wouldn't have it any other way.
